APPLICANTS AND NEW MEMBERS

1. Applicants must possess a valid Possession and Acquisition Licence for Restricted Firearms prior to acceptance for membership.
2. A total initiation fee \$150.00, plus annual dues \$295.00 (*\$250.00 club dues plus \$45.00 CSSA membership fee*) is payable.
3. The applicant should send a completed application form to the club e-mail address or by post to the post office box address.
4. When accepted to attend the Club Level Safety Course the applicant will pay \$150.00 plus CSSA Membership (currently \$45.00) for a total of \$195.00, which is non-refundable. The applicant will receive a copy of the club Rules and Regulations and become eligible to attend the Club Level Safety Course.
5. After passing the Club Level Safety course the applicant will be required to serve a 3 month probationary period during which the applicant must attend six times to shoot under supervision of any full member. Each time the applicant attends at the club to shoot they should have their record of attendance form with them and that form should be signed by the supervising full member as a record for the required number of shoot nights under supervision.
6. Upon completion of the probationary period, including the required number of shoot nights, the range or safety officer will present the new applicant for consideration as a new member during new business discussions at any regular monthly meeting. Regular business meetings are held on the first Wednesday of each month at 8.00pm. The Range and Safety Officer must sign the application and include comments as required.
7. If accepted for membership the applicant will be asked to pay the applicable pro-rated dues. Membership will be finalized and the secretary will apply for an ATT on the new member's behalf when all fees have been paid.
8. The secretary will supply the new member their ATT, name badge, membership card and door lock code.

Range Rules and Regulations

SAFETY

1. Firearms must be used in a safe manner.
2. Firearms shall only be loaded on the firing line.
3. All loaded firearms must be pointed down range.
4. Firearms will be handled only on the firing line. The shelf at the back of the range is for storage only.
5. Eye and ear protection must be worn on the firing line at all times, this includes spectators.
6. No eating or drinking is allowed in the active range area
7. Obey “range in use lights”, enter or exit only when green light is on.
8. When not on the firing line, all semi-automatic firearms must be unloaded with the action open and the magazine removed. Revolvers must have the cylinders swung open and empty. Rifles of approved calibers must have actions open and be standing in the rifle rack provided.
9. Shooters must stand behind the yellow line (fatigue mat) when not shooting.
10. The designated range safety officer has absolute authority on the firing line.
11. Members must obey the commands of the range safety officer and abide by his/her decisions.
12. Shooting alone can be dangerous. Your safety is your responsibility. Use caution and common sense.
13. The range safety officer will examine each firearm to ensure it is unloaded and safe before moving downrange.
14. No person may approach the firing line (ahead of yellow line) while shooters are downrange.
15. No person shall handle any firearm without the permission of the owner.
16. There shall be no open ammunition or charged magazines unattended in the lounge area of the building, only on the firing line.
17. No person shall be under the influence of alcohol or narcotics while on club property.
18. Guests must be directly supervised by a member standing at his/her shoulder while on the firing line.
19. Members and guests are reminded that airborne particles containing propellant powder or lead dust may adhere to the body or clothing after shooting and are urged to wash thoroughly.

AMMUNITION.

1. Handgun ammunition must not exceed 1,800 pfs (feet per second) velocity or 1,800 ft pd (foot pounds of energy).
2. Military surplus handgun ammunition that may contain steel core must not be used and shooters must be able to demonstrate lead-only bullet composition by snipping bullets in half with hand held cutter.
3. Centerfire rifle cartridges must not be used, **even in handguns designed to use them.**
4. Rifles chambered for handgun cartridges may be used on the range but the load, muzzle velocity and foot pounds energy at 20 yards must be supplied to the Range Operator prior to use.
5. Black powder rifles and handguns up to 75 caliber may be used on the range but the load, muzzle velocity and foot pounds energy at 20 yards must be supplied to the Range Operator prior to use.

6. No handgun cartridge bullets made of alloy hard enough to damage the backstop may be used.
7. No cartridges shall be hand loaded to the point where they will damage the backstop.
8. Steel shot shells may not be used on the range
9. BB's may not be used on the range

RANGE CONDUCT.

1. Members are responsible to ensure all Federal and Provincial laws are observed.
2. Members and guest nametags must be worn at all times on club property.
3. Alcohol is not permitted on club property at any time.
4. Members are asked to keep club property clean and in good working order.
5. Shooters will pick up and remove spent brass cases at the conclusion of the shooting session.
6. If a shotgun is used on the range, shooters must pick up and dispose of all wadding and debris.
7. Shooters must dispose of all used targets.
8. Brass is recycled. Only put brass into container on range marked "BRASS".
9. No shooting late at night that may disturb our neighbors (after 11pm, before 8am).
10. Members are fully responsible for their guests.
11. Members will ensure that guests sign in the attendance book for insurance purposes.
12. Members must pay a \$1.00 insurance charge each time a guest attends at the range.
13. Members must report damage to an executive member as soon as possible.
14. Members must report any safety violation to an executive member as soon as possible.
15. Only approved targets may be used on the range.
16. Persons using club facilities must secure the building using the closing procedures posted therein.
17. The range is a non-smoking facility. Halton Hills By-Law # 2003-0050
